FROM BISHOP PERSICO:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When we think of mission territory, we are likely to think of Africa or Asia, not of parts of our own country. Yet, there are many poor, sparsely populated dioceses in our country who need our help to minister to the People of God and to spread the Good News. **The Collection for National Needs, to be taken this year on July 20 and 21**, gives each of us the opportunity to stand in solidarity with poorer dioceses in the United States. This collection is a combination of two other collections:

- The Catholic Home Missions Appeal impacts the lives of nearly 9 million Catholics. Through annual grants, the Catholic Home Missions Appeal funds catechesis for children and adults, seminarian education, lay ministry training, Hispanic ministry and other pastoral programs in needy dioceses. The dioceses funded by the appeal comprise nearly 45 percent of all US dioceses.
- The Black and Indian Mission Collection helps to evangelize and support our African American, Native American and Alaskan Native communities with mission schools, religious education programs, the purchase of catechetical materials and ministry training.

The struggle to receive basic pastoral care and catechesis is faced by thousands of faithful living in dioceses within our own country. I ask your generous response to the Collection for National Needs on July 20 and 21. Your support will truly make a difference in strengthening the Church at home. Be assured of my prayers for you and your families in these summer months.

Ministry Formation for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion - Sunday, July 21 or Sunday, July 28 after Mass presented by Fr. David and Deacon Tom

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) are commissioned for a period of three years to a specific parish or institution. Lay communion ministers are recommended by their pastor to the bishop who grants approval for the pastor to commission the lay minister. Commissions must be renewed after the three-year period.

Those interested in this ministry along with currently commissioned EMHC *must* attend this formation and have their names submitted to the bishop for a new three-year term. The sign-up sheet for this formation can be found in the gathering space along with an information sheet with the requirements and characteristics required for those active in this ministry. 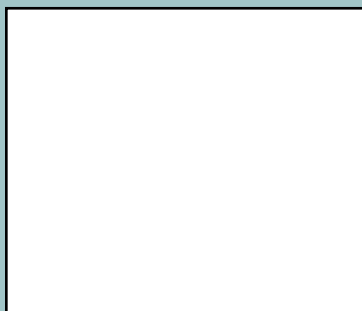
